Do you know what happens when your child with a disability turns 18 years old?

Do you want to learn more about an option called "Supported Decision-Making" that can help your child make decisions into adulthood?

In Massachusetts, when people turn 18, they become legal adults. This means the law says they can now decide about their education, health care, finances, and other personal matters.

Some families may be told that going to court for guardianship is the only way to continue caring for their child in adulthood. But that is not true. There are other options, including Supported Decision-Making, to consider first.
